Kim Galloway McHale & Beverly Galloway





Linda's Chocolate Chess Pie

1/2 c butter
1 oz unsweetened chocolate
1 1/2 c sugar
2/3 c evaporated milk
3 eggs, beaten
1/4 t salt
1 t vanilla
9 inch pie shell, unbaked

Place butter and chocolate in a saucepan; heat until melted completely. Stir in sugar, evaporated milk, eggs, salt, and vanilla. Pour into pie shell. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes.

WSL PROGRAMS

If your summer schedule allows, ASO Tuneful Tales may be one of the best experiences you will have as a WSL volunteer! ASO Tuneful Tales, formally known as the Children's Day Art Park, is a free, fun-filled family event that runs Wednesdays from June through July at the Austin Public Library Central Library. It will be a wonderful way to spend a few hours in the morning once a week introducing music into the lives of children.

For decades, children from all over Austin gathered outside at Symphony Square once a week to learn and be enveloped by music. ASO Tuneful Tales has undergone many changes over the past few years, including name and location changes; however, the essence of the program remains the same.

Each week, the main feature is an ASO ensemble performing music to a well-known children's story. Before and after the show, youngsters visit the Instrument Zoo in the lobby of the library where they can see, touch, and play instruments, as well as talk with Symphony musicians.

Selecting ASO Tuneful Tales as your volunteer placement for the year is a wonderful opportunity to see the direct impact of music in our community. As a WSL volunteer, you select a few Wednesdays that fit within your schedule to volunteer downtown at the Austin Public Library. Parking in the garage is a breeze, and your job for the next two-to-three hours is to watch the joy on a child's face the first time they pull a bow over a cello or shake a maraca. Many WSL volunteers bring their own children to enjoy in the fun. From toddlers to elementary school children, each can find a new instrument to love or a piece of music to cherish.
